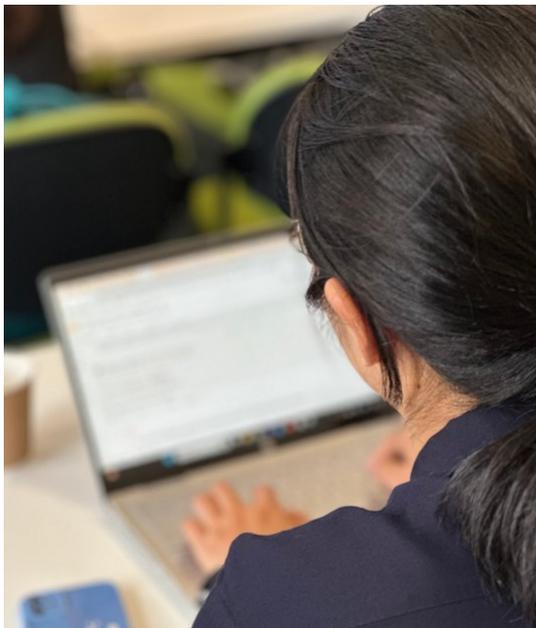
In addition, MEDAL will be represented by coordinator Izabela Jordanoska at the ['Science Weekend' festival](#) in Nijmegen.

Dagmar & Petar at SLE

MEDAL's Dagmar Divjak and Petar Millin gave one of the plenary talks at this year's SLE conference.

In their talk, they examined whether linguistic expertise remains essential in an era when scale and computation often outperform carefully designed symbolic systems. The rapid rise of large language models has intensified the long-standing debate between theory-driven and data-driven approaches to language.

Drawing on their research at the intersection of linguistics, psychology, and artificial intelligence, they reflected on how linguistic knowledge can both inform and critically evaluate data-driven models—and where it may need to evolve.
